In December, Home Depot Canada Utilized their Building Community grants to support the Richmond Hill Shelter. They built a recycling and garbage collection mechanism, installed much needed storage space in the washroom and laundry room. This has enabled the shelter to accept donations and make them available to the women and children accessing our services. We look forward to having them return to the shelter in the spring to enhance the backyard garden and play area!!

Sandgate Women's Shelter of York Region Inc. held Art as Activism at the beautiful Markham Museum on December 10/12 to engage in interactive theatre to share ways to empower marginalized communities, view beautiful artwork, paint Community Canvases for the shelter and dance to family-friendly music. A great time was held by all who attended.

The Moving Forward Foundation and staff members from the Vaughan Citizen provided every woman and all the children at the shelter and transition housing with gifts. All of the 12 children had several packages of age appropriate toys and 18 women had amazing care packages worth over \$300 including appointments for hair care, massage and grocery gift cards. The women and children also received bran new flip flops and slippers, various sizes. In addition, the children received bath robes. The generosity of the donors were really appreciated by the all the recipients of these gifts over the holiday season.

This place does not look familiar to me . I'm confused.

Here the ceilings are high and the paint is bright and the voices appear to be new. Each hand comes out to me and not down. Each word is smooth and not loud. God, where are I?

I'm tired but stay up in fear of fear, that what I endured would return; my real life nightmare.

Where do I go when nothing is right and I have nothing left? When the odds are against me and all I have is my heart on the table to bet?

Here I am, this safe house where I should be protected from the tide, waiting patiently for the shore to wash up my peace, my strength and my pride.

This time I will wait and not return. This time I will believe in their words. You're brave, you're a survivor, you're beautiful, you're more than you know.

In this safe place, where the ceilings are high and the walls are bright, where nothing was right and I had nothing left, where the odds were against me, they showed my life is worth more than a bet.

#### TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

Sandgate has established short term transitional housing units to assist women in their quest to establish lives free from violence. Sandgate acknowledges safe, affordable housing is often a barrier to the women we serve. These units are meant to be an interim solution to the long term goal for women's success. In an effort to support as many women as possible, these units are available on a short term basis of six months. The units available include one - 3 bedroom, one- 2 bedroom and 2- 2 studio apartments (one wheelchair assessable). These second stage housing units are available to women and their children using the services of Sandgate Women's Shelter of York Region.

CHILD WITNESS PROGRAM Our Child Witness Program is called the "Let's Talk" program. The program is designed to help children throughout York Region understand the cycle of abuse and to deal with their feelings as witnesses to violence against women.

Group support is offered to children ages 4–16 and runs on a ten (10) week cycle. A concurrent mother's group covers the same topic each week as the children's group. Mothers are invited and encouraged to attend this group to support their children's learning in the program. The "Let's Talk" program is run out of various locations in York Region in the evenings free of charge.

Summer programs are offered for a full week in July and August free of charge. The dates are July 16-20 and August 20-24. Please call the Groups Facilitator at 905-476-8993 ext. 202
